Dylan Willoughby is a permanently disabled poet, composer, music producer, music video producer, classical pianist, and photographer, born in London, England, and currently living in Long Beach, CA.

Chester Creek Press has published 3 limited-edition letterpress poetry chapbooks, Les Festivals des Murmures, Dusk at St. Mark's And Other Poems, and Thrive, with illustrations by the painter Anthony Mastromatteo. The chapbooks are held at many universities, The British Library, and in many private collections.

Dylan's poems have appeared widely in literary magazines including Shenandoah, Salmagundi, Southern Humanities Review, Green Mountains Review, Agenda (England), Stand (England), The Selkie (Scotland), and many other fora and venues. Some of his poems explore his Welsh heritage (and utilize Welsh forms and myths), while other poems delve into his struggles with disability and chronic illness.

Dylan's fiction has appeared in STORY and Roi Fainéant. Nonfiction has appeared in Impose Magazine and Red Fez. Photography appears in print in Wrongdoing Magazine and Storm Cellar and online in On the Sea Wall, Rejection Letters, Agapanthus, Stirring, ZiN Daily, Sage Cigarettes, and Hyacinth Review. He collaborated with Alina Stefanescu and Miriam Calleja on a mixed media project that appeared recently in On The Seawall.

Dylan has received residency fellowships from Yaddo and MacDowell, and earned an MFA from Cornell University, where he studied with A. R. Ammons and Robert Morgan. He received his B.A., summa cum laude, from Cornell, where he wrote his senior thesis on Wordsworth's "Salisbury Plain" poems, under the tutelage of Stephen Parrish and Reeve Parker.

Dylan's music, as "Lost in Stars," has been featured by The Los Angeles Times, NPR/PRI program "Echoes," KCRW (LA NPR station), NYLON magazine, XLR8R, Insomniac, Earmilk, PopMatters, Impose Magazine, and many other venues, and is available for purchase on Bandcamp.
